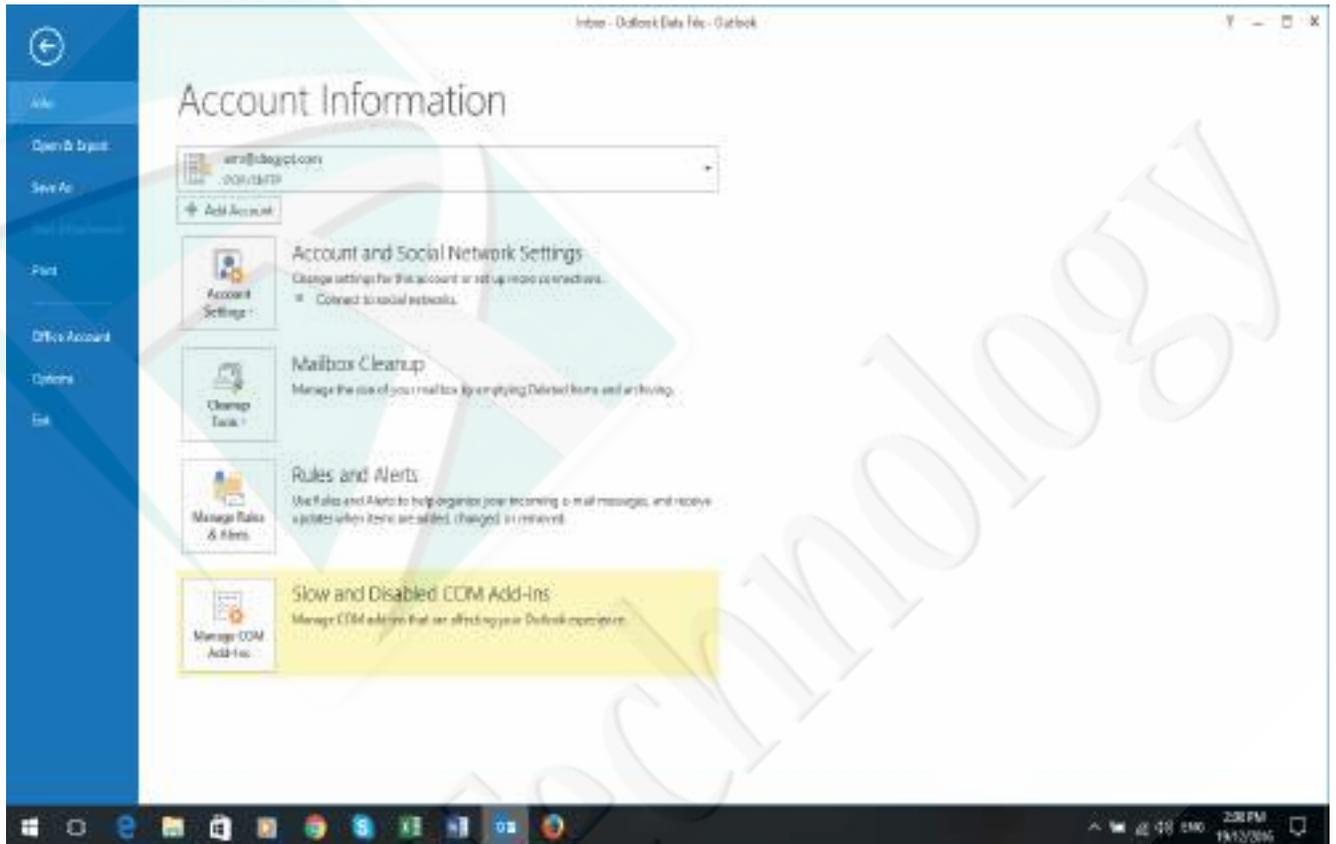


Setup your Mail Accounts using MS Outlook 2013

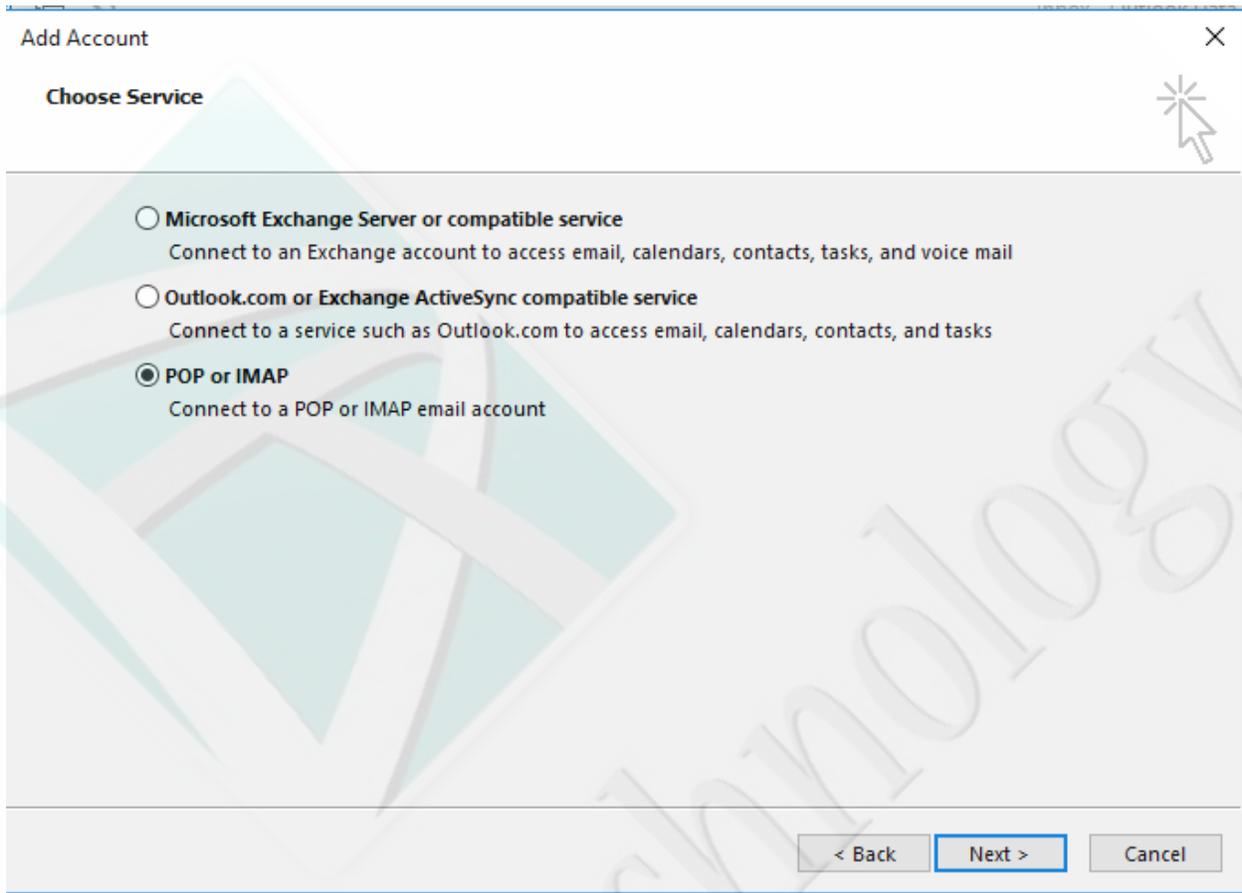

Choose pop Account “IMAP account will sync with the server, so if you delete an E-mail, it will be deleted from the server, so it is better to choose POP, in the same time the IMAP have a feature that it will keep your sent messages on the server when you sent it from your mobile or other devices, while POP mail account don’t save anything you sent on the server, it only keeps the incoming mail if you have the setting checked to keep a copy of messages on server”

Enter your server’s data mail.domainname.com, user name “your full E-mail address, and password , Please write the data for both Incoming and outgoing mail servers, from the top right corner press Next

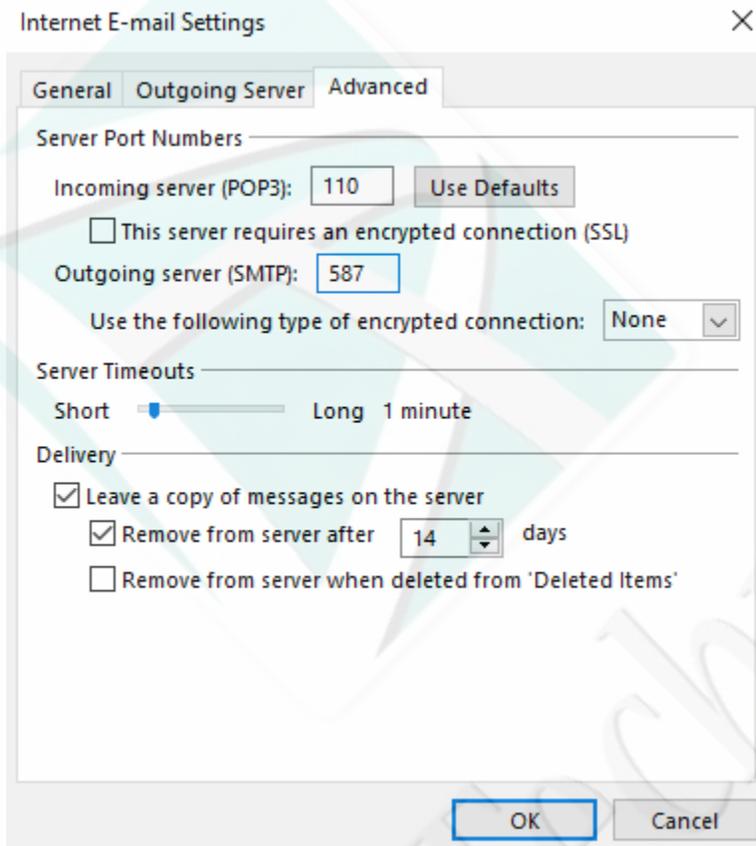
